VISIONARY DONORS PAVE THE WAY FOR THE UCSF-JOHN MUIR HEALTH CANCER CENTER

Thanks to two generous donors, John Muir Health is poised for a groundbreaking leap in cancer care.

The Hofmann Family Foundation's extraordinary \$25 million gift, the largest ever received by John Muir Health, will establish the UCSF-John Muir Health Jean and Ken Hofmann Cancer Cancer, and will propel advancements in cancer care, clinical trials, research, and support services in designated locations of the UCSF-John Muir Health Cancer Network.

The Behring Global Educational Foundation's (BGEF) remarkable \$20 million gift secured the naming rights for establishing the Behring Pavilion, which will house the Jean and Ken Hofmann Cancer Center.

These remarkable gifts are pivotal in providing cutting-edge treatments and a beacon of hope for cancer patients in the East Bay. Multi-Disciplinary Breast Cancer Program Reaches a Significant Milestone

John Muir Health's Multi-Disciplinary Breast Cancer Program surpassed five years and has served nearly 1,000 patients. The unique program offers patients with breast cancer the opportunity to meet with a breast surgeon, medical oncologist, and radiation oncologist all in one day to develop an individualized treatment plan. Patients receive multiple medical opinions from a group of specialists, helping them feel confident that all options have been explored. For patients and their family members, the team approach reduces the anxiety and uncertainty of waiting days or weeks between individual appointments. The single-day setting minimizes the time between diagnosis and treatments, and allows patients to focus their energy on what is most important: getting well.

The Multi-Disciplinary Breast Cancer Program offers the most advanced therapies and the latest technologies available to diagnose and treat breast cancer. John Muir Health is proud of its accreditation by the Commission on Cancer (CoC) and the National Accreditation Program for Breast Centers (NAPBC) and its recognition as a Breast Cancer Program that delivers the highest level of patient care with quality assurance practices that maintain it as a center of excellence. The health system's Radiation Oncology department is also nationally accredited by the American College of Radiology (ACR) and stays current with best practices and rapidly evolving treatment guidelines to provide the very best care to our patients.



Our goal is to ensure that patients receive the best treatment for their specific needs. Our multi-disciplinary approach leads to better outcomes with improved quality of life and survival rates for women and men with breast cancer.
