Steel Structures Take Shape

JOHN MUIR HEALTH'S IMPRESSIVE EXPANSION PROJECTS MOVE ONWARD AND UPWARD

Less than eight months after breaking ground for the new expansion projects at John Muir Medical Center's campuses in Walnut Creek and Concord, massive angles of steel framework have already begun to emerge from both construction

sites. "Both projects are running on time and on budget," says Michael Monaldo, Vice President of Facilities Development for John Muir Health.

While construction is concurrent at both campuses, each site has unique factors that affect how each of the

new patient care towers is being built. "Concord has an unusually high water table, so we had to plan accordingly," says Monaldo. After arduous draining of the excavation site, the building's foundation was poured on one day, requiring

4,500 cubic yards of concrete, poured at 580 cubic yards per hour. Due to physical space constraints around the Walnut Creek campus' temporary helipad, the framework of its structure is being built in five-story segments, rather than one entire floor atop another. The steel framework at both campuses is scheduled to be completed by early 2009.

"These are exciting building projects, and the benefits to the community will be widespread, as well," says Catherine Kutsuris, Chair of the John Muir Health Building Committee. "John Muir Health is clearly committed to ensuring that we all have the best healthcare possible, now and in the future—right here, where we need it most."



In the five years since Rick Cronk retired from Dreyer's Ice Cream—a company he helped build during his 25-year career there—he and his wife, Janet, have been focused on giving back to the community. The Lafayette couple say the thoughtful care John Muir Health physicians have provided to their family over the years prompted their decision to donate \$1 million to the John Muir Health Foundation.

The Cronks made their generous gift in honor of two dedicated physicians—cardiologist Sally Davis, M.D., and hospitalist Peter Rowe, M.D.—who were stunned to learn that their names will emblazon hospital wings on the fifth floor of the new patient care tower at John Muir Medical Center, Walnut Creek Campus. Dr. Davis and Dr. Rowe will each have a Medical-Surgical Wing named in their honor. "Both were instrumental in taking care of Rick's parents and my

mother," Janet says. "They are so caring and always explain everything to us.
Once, Peter was rushing out of the hospital on his way to a wedding, but he still took time to stop and help my mother."

"You get thanked in different ways from patients, and this is almost overwhelming," Dr. Davis says. "It's one of the greatest honors of my life. Dr. Rowe and I are very honored by this, and it is really for what all of our physicians do every day."

The Cronks believe strongly that the expansion under way at the Walnut Creek Campus will help attract even more great doctors to John Muir. They also hope that their gift will encourage others to make Campaign gifts in honor of John Muir physicians and nurses. As Rick puts it, "We're blessed to have a world-class hospital in our community, and people should support it."

A Gift from the Heart


HEAD HOUSEKEEPER CARLOS DARIO PEREZ OFFERS A HELPING HAND TO EVERYONE HE MEETS
