The Audition/Sub-I Rotation

Now that you have your 4th year schedule mapped out, how are you going to stand out amongst all other clerks rotating & vying for those PGY-1 slots? Here are some tips:

- 1. **Teamwork**. Do you work well with all members of the team, from the lowest ranking to the highest? All of our employees provide input on potential candidates. Be a good teammate and respect everyone, after all, you will work with them for at least three years.
- 2. **Going above & beyond**. If you have an interesting case coming in, why not take a moment to research the topic beforehand? Your preceptor will notice.
- 3. **Being punctual**. Otherwise, you run the risk of looking like you are not taking the opportunity seriously.
- 4. **Cell phone usage**. While you may use your cellphone for medical research, it is important to let your preceptor know, so it doesn't appear as though you are unengaged and using it for social purposes.
- 5. **Dressing appropriately**. If you are not sure what that entails, on day one show up in professional attire and then gauge how those around you dress then adjust as needed.
- 6. **Know the staff.** Get to know the Residency Coordinator and administrative staff. They can and will help you in so many ways.
