

# Specialty Care Program: 2018 Data Snapshot

## PROGRAM BACKGROUND

**Program Start:** 2011

**Program Description:** Access to specialty care has been identified as one of the greatest health care needs of low income, uninsured residents in Contra Costa County. Through a partnership with La Clínica de la Raza, John Muir Health provides specialty care for uninsured and low-income patients to include diagnostic, outpatient, and inpatient care at JMH facilities from JMH affiliated physicians. The program is based in the Cancer Institute and addresses needs for breast, gynecologic, thoracic, urologic, thyroid and gastroenterological services.

**Primary Goal** to increase direct access to specialty services for uninsured individuals.

### High-Level Results

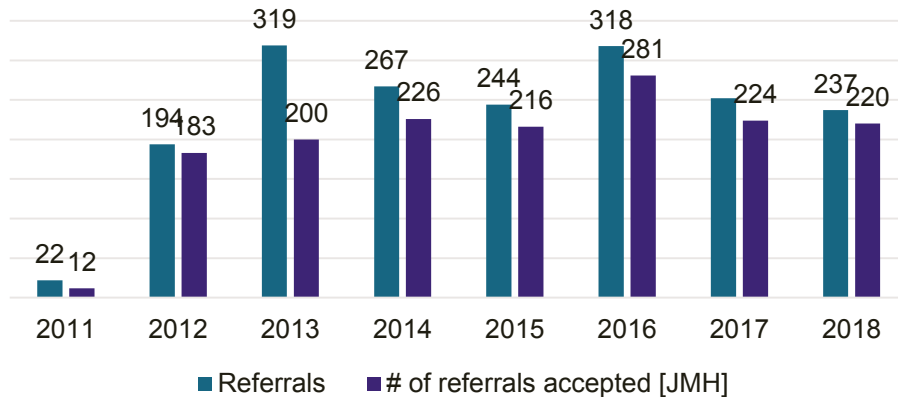
- ❖ To date, Specialty Care Program received **1,853** referrals and served **1,562** patients.
- ❖ **100%** of patients treated were uninsured.
- ❖ The program has made **55** cancer diagnoses to date.

In 2018, Specialty Care Program has served **220 patients**.

#### Referrals

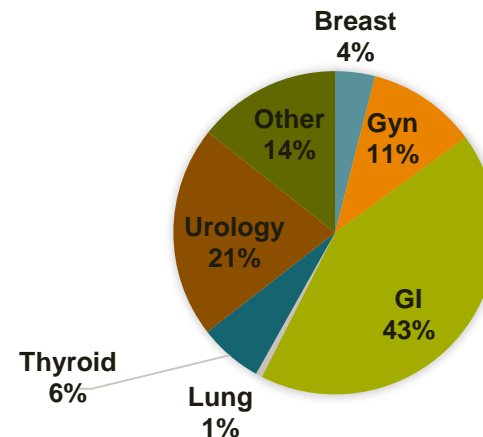


Among the 220 patients in 2018, there were a total of 628 clinical encounters for specialty services.

#### Health Condition by Specialist Encounters

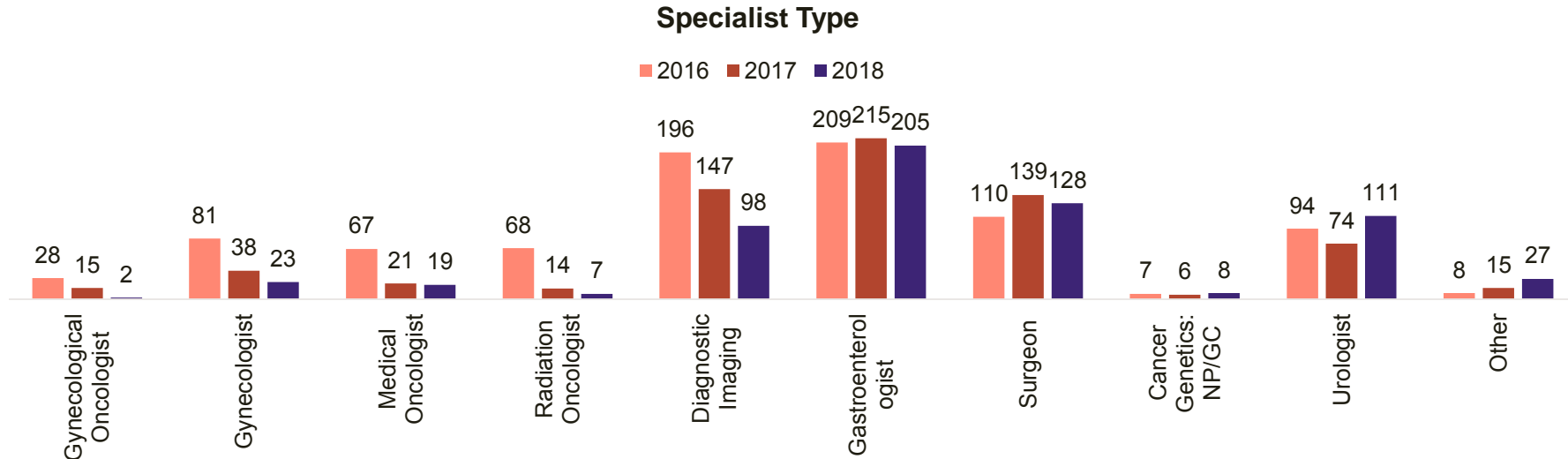

## SPECIALTY SERVICES AND TREATMENT

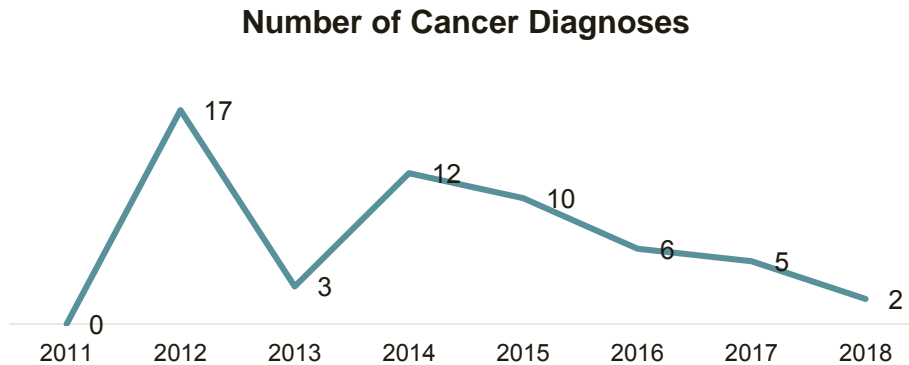
### John Muir Health Specialists
